I. SCOPE

This policy applies to all members of the Frewsburg Fire District and shall be always adhered to unless otherwise directed by a Chief Officer.

II. PURPOSE

This policy serves to identify the proper response order to be used when responding to specific calls.

III. PROCEDURE

In accordance with the Chautauqua County Fire Chief's Association and dispatch procedures, the Sheriff's Department will dispatch Frewsburg Fire District emergency response units as follows.

1. EMS:

Town of Carroll- A-341, M-341 (only if A-341 has full crew)

South Valley- A-341, M-341, E-342

2. **MVA:** A-341, E-341, M-341, E-342

3. **GRASS FIRES:** E-34, M-341 W/ATV-341, T-341, E-342, A-341

4. **STRUCTURE FIRES:** E-342, E-341, T-341, A-341, M-341

5. **VEHICLE FIRES:** E-342, E-341, A-341, M-341, and T-341 if needed.

6. **RUBBISH/ DUMPSTER FIRES:** E-341, E-342, T-341, M-341, T-341

7. SEARCHES, HAZARDOUS CONDITIONS, SERVICE CALLS

All members are to meet at station 1 for assignment. Receive instructions from officer in charge prior to responding to call location.

8. MEDEVAC:

E-342 is to be used to secure the landing zone. The LZ is a 100'X100' square, marked with flares/cones on all four corners. A hose line shall be pulled off but is not required to be charged. Firefighters on the hose line shall be in full turnout gear.

9. SPECIAL CALL:

The Fire Chief/ Incident Commander, may special call any additional equipment by request directly to the Sheriff's Department Dispatch Center.

10. MUTUAL AID:

All members shall respond to the station to receive directions from a chief officer. Only the equipment requested will respond to the scene unless directed otherwise by a Chief Officer.

11. SIMULTANEOUS CALLS:

When multiple incidents occur simultaneously, the first chief officer on the scene will evaluate each situation to determine the need for additional equipment and personnel to provide for appropriate response to the incidents and coverage for the District.
